A Celebration of New Life in Christ
& A Commemoration of the Faithful Departed

Since the persecution of the Early Church, those who have died in the faith have been remembered. The custom of a formal commemoration of all the martyrs on a single "memorial day" goes back to at least the third century.

"Saint" means "sacred one" or "holy one." All those who are in Christ are holy, in heaven and on earth.

The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther taught that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint; a sinner because of our sinful nature and a saint because of the love, forgiveness, and eternal life Jesus Christ has already attained for each of us.

Even in a world where accidents, disease, and violence are all around, death can find us unprepared. The remembrance of loved ones lost to this life takes on added significance. The promise of eternal life in Christ gives this present life purpose and hope. That purpose and hope in Christ is the focus of our worship and celebration.

Confession & Absolution

- P** In John’s vision in Revelation, one of the elders asks, “These in white robes – who are they, and where did they come from?” Unsure, John responds:
- C** “**Sir, you know.**”
- P** He did not recognize the saints of God in his midst. Often, we too are unable to perceive God’s holy ones around us. Like the goats in Matthew’s Gospel, we are astonished to learn that we have failed to serve God’s own.
- C** “**Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?**”
- P** “I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.” (*Matthew 25:44*)
- C** **Lord Jesus, forgive our failure to recognize and serve those you died to make holy. Open our eyes to see others robed in your holiness and to love even our enemies as you have loved us.**

We take time in silence to confess our personal and communal sin before God, confident that we will receive forgiveness.

- P** “These in white robes – who are they, and where did they come from?” You are those who have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. You are children of God who are blessed by your Father, and given a kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. You are those who hope in Christ, and “All who have this hope in him purify

themselves, just as he is pure.” (1 John 3:3) Saints of God, it is my joy and privilege to forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the ✠ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Though you are both Saint and sinner, your past, present, and future have been redeemed by Jesus: when Christ appears you will be like him.

We give you thanks that by his death he destroyed the power of death and by his resurrection he opened the kingdom of heaven to all believers. Strengthen us in the confidence that because he lives we shall live also, and that neither death nor life nor things present nor things to come will be able to separate us from your love, which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
