- P** John did not recognize the saints of God in his midst. Often, we too are unable to perceive God’s holy ones around us. Like the goats in Matthew’s Gospel, we are astonished to learn that we have failed to serve God’s own.
- C** **“Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?”**
- P** “I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.” (*Matthew 25:44*)
- C** **Lord Jesus, forgive our failure to recognize and serve those you died to make holy. Open our eyes to see others clothed in your holiness and to love even our enemies as you have loved us.**

*We take time in silence to confess our personal and communal sin before God, confident that we will receive forgiveness.*

- P** “These in white robes – who are they, and where did they come from?” You are those who have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. You are blessed children of God and inheritors of a kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. You are those who hope in Christ, and “All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.” (*1 John 3:3*) Saints of God, it is my joy and privilege to forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the ✠ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Though you are both saint and sinner, your past, present, and future have been redeemed by Jesus: when Christ appears you will be like him.

### First Reading

*Revelation 6:1-7:8*

I watched as the Lamb opened the first of the seven seals. Then I heard one of the four living creatures say in a voice like thunder, "Come!"<sup>2</sup> I looked, and there before me was a white horse! Its rider held a bow, and he was given a crown, and he rode out as a conqueror bent on conquest.

<sup>3</sup> When the Lamb opened the second seal, I heard the second living creature say, "Come!"<sup>4</sup> Then another horse came out, a fiery red one. Its rider was given power to take peace from the earth and to make people kill each other. To him was given a large sword.

<sup>5</sup> When the Lamb opened the third seal, I heard the third living creature say, "Come!" I looked, and there before me was a black horse! Its rider was holding a pair of scales in his hand. <sup>6</sup> Then I heard what sounded like a voice among the four living creatures, saying, "Two pounds of wheat for a day's wages, and six pounds<sup>[c]</sup> of barley for a day's wages, and do not damage the oil and the wine!"

<sup>7</sup> When the Lamb opened the fourth seal, I heard the voice of the fourth living creature say, "Come!"<sup>8</sup> I looked, and there before me was a pale horse! Its rider was named Death, and Hades was following close behind him. They were given power over a fourth of the earth to kill by sword, famine, and plague, and by the wild beasts of the earth.

<sup>9</sup> When he opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain because of the word of God and the testimony they had maintained. <sup>10</sup> They called out in a loud voice, "How long, Sovereign Lord, holy and true, until you judge the inhabitants of the earth and avenge our blood?"<sup>11</sup> Then each of them was given a white robe, and they were told to wait a little longer, until the full number of their fellow servants, their brothers and sisters, were killed just as they had been.

<sup>12</sup> I watched as he opened the sixth seal. There was a great earthquake. The sun turned black like sackcloth made of goat hair, the whole moon turned blood red,<sup>13</sup> and the stars in the sky fell to earth, as figs drop from a fig tree when shaken by a strong wind. <sup>14</sup> The heavens receded like a scroll being rolled up, and every mountain and island was removed from its place.

<sup>15</sup> Then the kings of the earth, the princes, the generals, the rich, the mighty, and everyone else, both slave and free, hid in caves and among the rocks of the mountains. <sup>16</sup> They called to the mountains and the rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb!"<sup>17</sup> For the great day of their wrath has come, and who can withstand it?"

<sup>7</sup> After this I saw four angels standing at the four corners of the earth, holding back the four winds of the earth to prevent any wind from blowing on the land or on the sea or on any tree. <sup>2</sup> Then I saw another angel coming up from the east, having the seal of the living God. He called out in a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm the land and the sea: <sup>3</sup> “Do not harm the land or the sea or the trees until we put a seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.” <sup>4</sup> Then I heard the number of those who were sealed: 144,000 from all the tribes of Israel.

<sup>5</sup> From the tribe of Judah 12,000 were sealed,

from the tribe of Reuben 12,000,

from the tribe of Gad 12,000,

<sup>6</sup> from the tribe of Asher 12,000,

from the tribe of Naphtali 12,000,

from the tribe of Manasseh 12,000,

<sup>7</sup> from the tribe of Simeon 12,000,

from the tribe of Levi 12,000,

from the tribe of Issachar 12,000,

<sup>8</sup> from the tribe of Zebulun 12,000,

from the tribe of Joseph 12,000,

from the tribe of Benjamin 12,000.
