Confession and Absolution

- P** St. Paul exhorts the Christians in Rome to “Live in harmony with one another.”
- C** **We acknowledge that we settle for cold silence instead of harmony, because we are uncomfortable with peacemaking and conflict resolution.**
- P** He calls us to “not repay anyone evil for evil.”
- C** **Yet we often have the urge to try to have two wrongs make a right.**
- P** “If it is possible, as far as depends on you, live at peace with everyone,” Paul instructs.
- C** **We celebrate our divisions and remain polarized from those we disagree with.**
- P** For all the ways in which we fail to “be devoted to one another in love,”
- C** **Forgive us, Father.**

We take time in silence to confess our personal and communal sin before God, confident that we will receive forgiveness.

- P** Though we are slow to be reconciled to one another, we have a God who has given everything to be reconciled to us. God has refused to count your sins against you, and Christ’s death provides the assurance that God is committed to living in harmony with you. In the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit. Empowered by the reconciling work of Jesus, go forth to be reconciled to all those for whom Christ has died. Share his peace with all people.
- C** **Amen! Thanks be to God!**
