I will pasture them on the mountains of Israel, in the ravines and in all the settlements in the land. ¹⁴I will tend them in a good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel will be their grazing land. There they will lie down in good grazing land, and there they will feed in a rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵I myself will tend my sheep and have them lie down, declares the Sovereign LORD. ¹⁶I will search for the lost and bring back the strays. LWML BYTE: A HEALING SPACE FOR AT-RISK CHILDREN

Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch, North Dakota | \$100,000

A specialized chapel has been designed to provide hope and healing for at-risk children, ages 10 to 18, in the care of the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch, Bismarck, North Dakota, campus. Children at this facility have faced severe trauma in their lives, and need healing that only Jesus can give. This mission grant will help with building costs of the new chapel and provide spiritual care for these children, their families, and the Ranch staff.

Soup Suppers: We will hold our traditional soup suppers prior to Advent services this year. Year End Giving: Phase I of the 2023 Building Project raised \$65,000. Our approved loan amount of \$325,000 was lowered to \$260,000 resulting in a sizable long-term savings. Phase II will run until the end of 2023. Any additional offerings would cover overages or unforeseen costs. If there are no overages, the additional offerings will be used per the resolution passed at a Special Congregational Meeting on April 16, 2023. The resolution states, "If the project comes in under budget, we will either pay down our mortgage, or use these funds for Capital Improvements, to be decided by the congregation."

Phase II of this process continues! If you feel led to gift to the 2023 Building Project you may do so through your giving envelope or Vanco.
