## **Confession and Absolution**

- P** The epistle of James tells us:
- C** **“If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, ‘Love your neighbor as yourself,’ you are doing right.”**
- P** Yet we acknowledge that we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. Pastor Jonathan Fisk says in his book Echo, “The story of humanity is not one of stranger helping stranger by pursuing the best interest of others. It is not a tale of an earnestly peaceful people plagued by undeserved sickness and hungers. It is not a tale of striving hand-in-hand to make a better world for us all by sacrificing individual needs for the greater good. No, it is a story of brother setting his face against brother.”
- C** **We have put our own needs, wants, and desires ahead of those of our neighbor. Lord, have mercy on us and forgive us our sins.**

*We take time in silence to confess our personal and communal sin before God, confident that we will receive forgiveness.*

- P** James tells us that “mercy triumphs over judgment.” In the cross of Jesus the Christ, God has married mercy and judgment together, judging the Messiah according to our guilt and pouring out merciful grace in his blood. In the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit. In the waters of Baptism, you have been raised from death, empowered to truly love your neighbor as

yourself. Empowered by the Spirit of Christ, you can and will keep this royal law!

## Holy Baptism

**P** Holy Baptism is God's gift to us. In this Sacrament we become a part of the family of God as we are welcomed into the Church, which is the body of Christ. The Small Catechism says "Baptism is not water only, but it is water used together with God's word and by God's command." God's living Word of promise works powerfully with the water. Baptism is the death of the old sinner and a rebirth into new life in Christ.

**C** *"I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit." "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." (John 3:5; Mark 16:16a)*  
*"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18b-20)*

**P** *How are these children named?*

**R** Nathan David Skogerboe, Noah William Skogerboe, Aaralynn Catherine Skogerboe.

**P** *Receive the sign of the cross on your forehead and heart, because you are redeemed by Christ the crucified.*

**P** Today, Eric and Sarah, you are responding to the command of Jesus and the love that God has shown to Nathan, Noah and Aralynn, in the gift of Jesus himself. I ask you: will you faithfully bring these this child to worship, teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creeds and the Commandments, place in their hands the Holy Scriptures, and provide for their instruction in the Christian faith?

**R** We will, by God's grace.

**P** On behalf of Nathan, Noah, and Aralynn, do you as their parents reject the devil and all his works and all his ways?

**R** We do.

**P** Sponsors, will you pray for Nathan, Noah, and Aralynn, support their parents in their ongoing instruction and nurture in the Christian Faith, and love them in a way that gives an example of Christ's love?

**R** We will, with God's help.

**P** Saints of God in this congregation, will you support Nathan, Noah and Aralynn in their lives in Christ?

**C** **We will, by the power of the Spirit of Christ.**

**P** I ask their parents, sponsors, and the entire community to give witness to our faith. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth?

**C** **We do.**

**P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only son...living and the dead?

**C** **We do.**

**P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy catholic church... life everlasting?

**C** **We do.**

**P** Let us join hands and pray as a family the prayer that our Lord Jesus taught us.

## **Second Reading**

*James 2:1-17*

My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ

must not show favoritism. <sup>2</sup> Suppose a man comes into your

meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in

filthy old clothes also comes in. <sup>3</sup> If you show special attention to

the man wearing fine clothes and say, “Here’s a good seat for

you,” but say to the poor man, “You stand there” or “Sit on the

floor by my feet,” <sup>4</sup> have you not discriminated among yourselves

and become judges with evil thoughts?

<sup>5</sup> Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those

who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to

inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him? <sup>6</sup> But you

have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who are exploiting you?

Are they not the ones who are dragging you into court? <sup>7</sup> Are they

not the ones who are blaspheming the noble name of him to whom

you belong?

<sup>8</sup> If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, “Love your

neighbor as yourself,” you are doing right. <sup>9</sup> But if you show

favoritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as

lawbreakers. <sup>10</sup> For whoever keeps the whole law and yet

stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it. <sup>11</sup> For he who said, “You shall not commit adultery,” also said, “You shall not murder.” If you do not commit adultery but do commit murder, you have become a lawbreaker.

<sup>12</sup> Speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom, <sup>13</sup> because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

<sup>14</sup> What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? <sup>15</sup> Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. <sup>16</sup> If one of you says to them, “Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,” but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? <sup>17</sup> In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

*Mark 7:24-37*

**P** The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark the seventh chapter.

**C** Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>24</sup> Jesus left that place and went to the vicinity of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know it; yet he could not keep his presence secret. <sup>25</sup> In fact, as soon as she heard about him, a woman whose little daughter was possessed by an impure spirit came and fell at his feet. <sup>26</sup> The woman was a Greek, born in Syrian Phoenicia. She begged Jesus to drive the demon out of her daughter.

<sup>27</sup> “First let the children eat all they want,” he told her, “for it is not right to take the children’s bread and toss it to the dogs.”

<sup>28</sup> “Lord,” she replied, “even the dogs under the table eat the children’s crumbs.”

<sup>29</sup> Then he told her, “For such a reply, you may go; the demon has left your daughter.”

<sup>30</sup> She went home and found her child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

<sup>31</sup> Then Jesus left the vicinity of Tyre and went through Sidon, down to the Sea of Galilee and into the region of the Decapolis. <sup>32</sup> There some people brought to him a man who was deaf and could hardly talk, and they begged Jesus to place his hand on him.

<sup>33</sup> After he took him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spit and touched the man's tongue. <sup>34</sup> He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, "Ephphatha!" (which means "Be opened!"). <sup>35</sup> At this, the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosened and he began to speak plainly.

<sup>36</sup> Jesus commanded them not to tell anyone. But the more he did so, the more they kept talking about it. <sup>37</sup> People were overwhelmed with amazement. "He has done everything well," they said. "He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."
