Confession and Absolution

P We confess that we have strayed from your ways like lost sheep.

C **We have followed the desires of our own heart.**

P We have left undone things we ought to have done.

C **We have done things we ought not to have done.**

P Spare us, O God, and restore us according to your promises declared in your newborn son, Jesus Christ.

C **We see in the manger the Savior of the world; the Savior who brings God's forgiveness.**

We take time in silence to confess our personal and communal sin before God, confident that we will receive forgiveness.

P Light has come into the world. We admit that we seek darkness and sin instead of light and love. But Jesus is the Son of our loving God, and he takes away the sin of the world. Jesus has come to save you from darkness, sin and death. Hear the promise of Christ, "I have come into the world to be a light. No one who believes in me will stay in darkness." (*John 12:46*) He is talking about you. Because of Jesus, your sin is forgiven, and you will live as God's holy child forever. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit. Let us praise God for his love and for the gift of Jesus!

C **O come let us adore him, Christ the Lord!**

Sharing of the Peace

P The peace of the Christ child be with you always.

Second Reading

Hebrews 1:1-12

In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. ³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. ⁴ So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs.

⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say,
"You are my Son;
today I have become your Father"?"

Or again,
"I will be his Father,
and he will be my Son"?"

⁶ And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says,
"Let all God's angels worship him."

⁷ In speaking of the angels he says,
"He makes his angels spirits,
and his servants flames of fire."

⁸ But about the Son he says,
"Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever;
a scepter of justice will be the scepter of your kingdom.

⁹ You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness;
therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions
by anointing you with the oil of joy."

"In the beginning, Lord, you laid the foundations of the earth,

Holy Gospel

John 1:1-5, 9-14, 16-18

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the first chapter.

C Glory to you, O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁹ The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹² Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— ¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. ¹⁴ The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

¹⁶ Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given. ¹⁷ For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father, has made him known.

P We adore, thank and praise you, that by the birth of our Lord Jesus we, who lost paradise, are born again to a new kingdom and an endless paradise with you.

C **Holy Spirit, give us hearts to joyfully welcome Jesus as he reigns in us.**

P Let the good tidings of great joy that we rejoice in this night be know everywhere.

C **Bless your church throughout the world that it may be faithful in its witness and service to our Lord and to all people on Earth.**

P Guide the rulers of nations that peace may be found.

C **Meet the needs of all people by your good and gracious will.**

P Heal the ill and unburden those who struggle with depression and mental illness.

C **Let everyone who lives in sorrow look to you for consolation and be comforted.**

Eucharist Liturgy

P Lord God, Heavenly King, we give you thanks and praise on this holy morning when, in your goodness, you showed your supreme love for us by sending forth your only begotten Son, our Savior, to be born of a virgin, to save us all from sin. Before you formed the heavens and the earth, he was your Word. In him you made all things. In him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell.

Yet he did not count equality with God as a thing to be grasped but emptied himself to take the form of a servant, being born in our own likeness, even as a baby, lying in a manger.

For all these things, we give you thanks and herald his coming with the song of the angels:

C **Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace and goodwill to all people.**

P Eternal God, your Son, Jesus Christ, came to us in your name and showed your steadfast love for us. All that he did was by your will. All that he did was in your name. When we saw him, we saw the Father, for he was the image of the invisible God.

C **Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.**

P For love of you, O Lord, and for love of us, he offered himself up to death on a cross, that we might be saved from sin and death. Yet you did not let the powers of darkness prevail over him, but raised him from the dead to sit at your right hand in

glory. And now you have given to us who believe in him the promise of resurrection and eternal life.

C Hosanna in the highest!

P On the night before he died, our Lord Jesus took bread and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me. After supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this in remembrance of me.

C On this holy morning, O Lord we remember your humble birth in a manger. We proclaim your death and resurrection. We await your coming in glory.

P Send now your Holy Spirit upon us and bless these gifts of bread and wine. As Christ is Emmanuel, God with us, so fill our communion with his eternal presence, that we might know the joy and peace of his coming, have our faith renewed, and be strengthened in our hope for his return.

C O Word made flesh, be born in us again.

P Accept our prayers and praises, O Father, through your Son, our Savior, who was born this night, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, we give all honor and glory from generation to generation.

Distribution
