## Confession and Absolution

**P** When Jesus appeared to his disciples after the resurrection, sharing his peace with them and breathing out his Spirit, he sends them out with a promise:

**C** “If you forgive anyone’s sins, their sins are forgiven.”

**P** He also shares with them a warning:

**C** “If you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.”

**P** Jesus taught us to pray “forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us.” In his parable of a king and his servants, he teaches that we should expect God’s judgment if we will not forgive.

**C** Lord, forgive us for our failure to live out your mission to forgive. Help us to grasp the depth of your forgiveness, that we may forgive in kind. Soften our hearts that we may not withhold forgiveness.

*We take time in silence to confess our personal and communal sin before God, confident that we will receive forgiveness.*

**P** St. Paul says in Colossians, “Bear with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgive each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.” Our forgiveness for others always starts with God’s forgiveness of our sins! In the stead and by the command of our risen Lord and savior Jesus Christ, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit. God has forever let go of every debt you owe, cleansing you in the blood of the lamb. Go forth empowered by the Spirit of Christ to do the same to others!

**C Amen! Thanks be to God!**

### **Sharing of the Peace**

**P** One the evening of the first day of the week, the disciples gathered together. And because they were afraid of reprisals from the Jewish leaders, they had locked the doors to the place where they met. But suddenly Jesus appeared among them and said,

**C Peace be with you.**

**P** Then he showed them the wounds of his hands and his side – they were overjoyed to see the Lord with their own eyes! Jesus repeated his greeting,

**C Peace be with you.**

**P** Then eight days later, Thomas and all the others were in the house together. And even though all the doors were locked, Jesus suddenly stood before them and said,

**C Peace be with you.**

**P** As Christ’s body in this place, we share his peace with one another.

*The people greet one another in the name of the Lord as a sign of reconciliation and of the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (Matt. 5:22-24; Eph. 4:1-3).*

**P** Almighty God, you give us the joy of celebrating our Lord’s resurrection. Give us also the joys of life in your service and bring us at last to the full joy of life eternal, through Jesus Christ, our

## **First Reading**

*Acts 2:14a, 22-32*

<sup>14</sup> Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: “Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. <sup>22</sup> “Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. <sup>23</sup> This man was handed over to you by God’s deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. <sup>24</sup> But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. <sup>25</sup> David said about him: “I saw the Lord always before me.

Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken.

<sup>26</sup> Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest in hope,

<sup>27</sup> because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, you will not let your holy one see decay.

<sup>28</sup> You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence.’

<sup>29</sup> “Fellow Israelites, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. <sup>30</sup> But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. <sup>31</sup> Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. <sup>32</sup> God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it.

## Second Reading

*1 Peter 1:3-9*

<sup>3</sup> Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, <sup>4</sup> and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, <sup>5</sup> who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. <sup>6</sup> In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. <sup>7</sup> These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. <sup>8</sup> Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, <sup>9</sup> for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

## Holy Gospel

*John 20:19-31*

**P** The Holy Gospel according to St. John the twentieth chapter.

**C** Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>19</sup> On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" <sup>20</sup> After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

<sup>21</sup> Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." <sup>22</sup> And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup> If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

<sup>24</sup> Now Thomas (also known as Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. <sup>25</sup> So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!"

But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

<sup>26</sup> A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" <sup>27</sup> Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

<sup>28</sup> Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

<sup>29</sup> Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

<sup>30</sup> Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. <sup>31</sup> But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

## REACHING JEWISH PEOPLE WITH THE GOSPEL IN ISRAEL THE APPLE OF HIS EYE MISSION SOCIETY, ASIA | \$100,000



### *Sharing the Gospel in Israel*

It is a unique time in Israel. There are six million Jewish people living in Israel today and there is an unprecedented openness by younger Jewish people to hear the Gospel. Requests for copies of the New Testament are at an all-time high. This makes the work of The Apple of His Eye Mission Society more important than it has ever been. They are meeting people where they are with lifesaving materials to share the Good News of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

The Apple of His Eye Mission Society exists to share the Good News of Jesus with the Jewish community. This is accomplished through partnering with the LCMS World Mission to plant Lutheran churches. They also develop resources for evangelism and for training new leaders for service in the church. The Apple of His Eye Mission Society has distributed over one million Gospel tracts, and they rely on God to provide resources through churches and individuals to carry out their mission efforts.

This grant will help progress plans to plant a new Lutheran Church in Tel Aviv, which is one of the most expensive cities in the world. The church will be led by an Israeli Jewish believer who is finishing his Master of Sacred Theology degree at Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft. Wayne, Indiana. Volunteers will have the opportunity to provide ongoing short-term mission support.
